INTENT:

ALL pupils leave primary school with a Futureproof approach to sports - ie they are physically literate and have the knowledge, skills, attitudes and confidence that will equip them with a healthy, active lifestyle, and ensure lifelong participation in physical activity or sport.

Objectives for the 2022-23 year:

1. Ensure all children have the skills and attitudes to participate in a range of physical activities
2. Ensure our youngest children have access to additional high-quality sports tuition to nurture the key sports skills they will need across their whole sports experience
3. Improve the variety of sports experiences on offer to all children, including after-school clubs and improving provision at break times
4. Broaden our engaging outdoor learning programme to encourage active, outdoor play and the 'soft skills' children will be able to transfer to all areas of life, including sports.
5. Improve the amount, and quality, of PE resources now that our sports coaching has been brought 'in-house', including improving the storage and maintenance of these resources so that they last longer
6. Improve our participation in competitive sports and inter-school events
7. Improve how 'active' break and lunch time sessions are to promote good, active habits for children
