INTENT:

ALL pupils leave primary school with a Futureproof approach to sports - ie they are physically literate and have the knowledge, skills, attitudes and confidence that will equip them with a healthy, active lifestyle, and ensure lifelong participation in physical activity or sport.

Objectives for the 2020-21 year:

1. Return all children to active and healthy play habits following the lockdowns in 2020 and 2021
2. Ensure our youngest children have access to additional high-quality sports tuition to nurture the key sports skills they will need across their whole sports experience
3. Improve the variety of sports experiences on offer to all children, including after-school clubs
4. Launch an engaging outdoor learning programme to encourage active, outdoor play and the 'soft skills' children will be able to transfer to all areas of life, including sports.
5. Improve the amount, and quality, of PE resources now that our sports coaching has been brought 'in-house'
6. Continue to offer participation in competitive sport (not possible due to C-19 restrictions)
